COMMISSION DECISION

of 9.8.2023

approving the amendment No. 1 of the Budget of the Euratom Supply Agency for the financial year 2023

(Text with EEA relevance)

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THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Atomic Energy Community and in particular Article 54 therof,

Having regard to the Statutes of the Euratom Supply Agency¹, and in particular Articles 1 and 7 thereof,

Having regard to the opinion of the Advisory Committee of the Agency, delivered on [21] June 2023,

Having regard to Regulation (EU, Euratom) 2018/1046 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 18 July 2018 on the financial rules applicable to the general budget of the European Union, amending Regulations (EU) No 1296/2013, (EU) No 1301/2013, (EU) No 1304/2013, (EU) No 1309/2013, (EU) No 1316/2013, (EU) No 223/2014, (EU) No 283/2014, and Decision No 541/2014/EU and repealing Regulation (EU, Euratom) No 966/2012, and in particular Article 68 thereof,

Having regard to Commission decision No C(2022) 9491 of 14 December 2022, adopting the budget of the Euratom Supply Agency for the financial year 2023,

Whereas:

- (1) The Council of the European Atomic Energy Community has decided² not to introduce the charge on transactions provided for in Article 54 of the Treaty establishing the European Atomic Energy Community and in Article 10 of the Statutes of the Euratom Supply Agency.
- (2) The Agency's own revenue, consisting of interest on its capital investments, is not sufficient to cover its operating expenses in 2023.
- (3) The Agency benefits from certain advantages in kind granted by the Commission, but not all its operational expenses are covered.
- (4) The Agency therefore requires a contribution from the Commission to cover its expenses that are not covered directly by the Commission budget.
- (5) Following the departure of ESA's Accounting Officer and in the light of the fact that the applicable statutory procedures for selecting a suitable successor could not bring

fruit, the function of the Agency's Accounting Officer had to be outsourced. Therefore, in line with Article 78(2) of the aforementioned Regulation (EU, Euratom) 2018/1046, a Service Level Agreement (SLA) was concluded in March 2023 between ESA and the Translation Centre for the Bodies of the European Union for the provision of accounting services to ESA.

- (6) In line with its statutory mission, the Agency needs to reinforce its monitoring of the nuclear fuel market to identify market trends that could affect security of the European Union's supply of nuclear materials and services.
- (7) Therefore, the Agency needs to provide specialist training to its staff and to undertake missions to selected utilities and producers in order to assess the status of preparations for increasing the European capacity in nuclear fuel cycle services (conversion, enrichment and fuel fabrication) and to better follow the implementation of the diversification plans established by the nuclear utilities to enhance security of supply.
- (8) The Agency is required under Article 1 of its Statutes to seek the advice of, be supported by and act in close cooperation with the Advisory Committee, established in accordance with Article 11 of the said Statutes.
- (9) The allocation for the meetings of the Advisory Committee needs to be reinforced due to travel cost increases.
- (10) Additional allocation was provided to reinforce the budget line 20 03 14 01 'Euratom contribution to the operation of the Euratom Supply Agency' by Directorate-General of Budget and Directorate-General for Energy.
- (11) The statement of revenue and the statement of expenditure in the Agency's budget for 2023, as approved by Commission Decision C(2022) 9491, have to be amended.
- (12) In accordance with Article 7(9) of the Agency's Statutes, any modification of the budget shall be the subject of an amending budget adopted by the same procedure as the initial budget.

HAS DECIDED AS FOLLOWS:

Sole Article

The Amendment No. 1 of the Budget of the Euratom Supply Agency for the financial year 2023, increasing the Agency's budget by EUR 30 160 to EUR 258 160, and applying internal transfers between titles and budget lines of the statement of expenditure in order to cover the provision of accounting services to ESA and to support the efforts towards the security of supply of nuclear fuel, as set out in the Annex, is hereby approved.
